Dear Louise and Phillip,

Our daughter Erin has now completed the first and second phases of the Cellfield program and I would like to thank you for giving us the opportunity to help Erin with her reading.

Although Erin has always been a bright girl and earned good grades at school we, as parents, were aware that Erin was not reading at the same level as her peers. The schooling system was unable to identify any problem or solutions. While it was a relief to have Margaret Harding prove, with her testing of Erin, that there was a problem we still had no adequate solutions until we were recommended to you.

At first we were skeptical about the Cellfield program but now, seeing the results that Erin has achieved, we are thrilled. We have seen the results of the pre and post tests and while Erin's improvement (after phase one of the Cellfield program) in these tests was remarkable it has been the change in Erin's ability and attitude toward reading (since completing phase two of the Cellfield program) that has thrilled us the most.

In the 3 months since commencing the program Erin has gone from begrudgingly reading 3 pages in a simple book over a 5 minute period to reading up to 40 pages in a single session lasting one hour. Erin is now reading age appropriate books willingly. She is even talking to friends about lending them her books because they would enjoy reading them too.

We realize that this is only the beginning of the change and that we will need to work with Erin to continue to develop her reading skills to the best of her ability but at least now we have seen the changes necessary to accommodate this.

We are very thankful to Louise, Phillip and the other staff at Tyquin Speech Pathology and Cellfield for your hard work and expertise in reprogramming (for want of a better term) Erin and allowing her to read effectively. I say without hesitation that it has been Erin's participation in the Cellfield program that has brought about the improvements in Erin's reading.
